## Housing Accomplishments

- Spearheaded Denver's first ever Eviction Defense Fund.
- Created the City's first dedicated housing fund, including a fee on development to build affordable homes.
- Expanded property tax rebates for low-income senior and disabled homeowners.
- Has been a champion for tiny homes, helping them to overcome barriers in our code.

## Plans for the Future

- Continue to increase our investments in new and preserved affordable housing.
- Continue to partner with communities and advocate until the city funds community land trusts.

## Sustainability Accomplishments

- Spearheaded the Energize Denver ordinance, which requires large commercial and family buildings to measure and publicly report their energy usage.
- Co-sponsored sales tax to fund parks and open spaces which voters overwhelmingly passed in 2018.
- Accelerated the use of curbside composting throughout the City and advocated for a reduction in our use of landfills.
