Making Homes More Affordable

Robin has spent the last 15 years expanding access to affordable housing. She spearheaded Denver's first-ever Eviction Defense Program and created the City's first dedicated housing fund, including a fee on development to help build affordable homes.

- Create more housing options for our low and middle-income communities as well as seniors
- Ensure communities have a voice in making development more inclusive and equitable.

Making Denver Sustainable

To protect Denver's beauty for future generations, Robin helped shape policy to benchmark and begin reducing energy consumption from commercial buildings, as well as climate plans for transitioning Denver to renewable energy. She also worked with the community to turn a blighted area in Globeville into the Platte Farm Open Space.

- Reducing the carbon footprint of city and commercial buildings
- Accelerating the use of curbside composting throughout the City and advocating for a reduction in our use of landfills.

Shaping Denver's Future

As our city grows, we need to invest in transportation choices that move people efficiently and safely. While serving on the Denver Regional Council of Governments, Robin helped set the vision and prioritized how federal infrastructure dollars were spent.

Robin's infrastructure plans include:

- Ensuring transit is more accessible, more affordable, and gets you where you're going faster.
- Expanding funding for sidewalks to make sure our walks to open spaces, transit centers or our homes are safer.
